## Editorial.

THE ROYAL BRITISH NURSES' ASSOCIATION.

• HE recent proceedings of the General Council of the Royal British Nurses' [6 Association deserve, and will doubt-less receive, widespread attention. We under-stand that Sir James Crichton-Browne has given notice of his intention to appeal against the judgment given against him in the City of London Court on October 16th, and against the verdict of the jury at the trial of the action on October 5th, which was practically to the effect that he had acted maliciously and wrongfully against Miss Margaret Breay, in his position as Chairman at the Annual Meeting of the Royal British Nurses' Association. We shall, therefore, abstain from all comment upon the legal proceedings until this appeal has been decided. And, for the same reason, we will withhold from publi-cation, until the same time, a number of letters which we have received from Nurses, from medical men, and from unprofessional persons, upon this matter.
