Editorial.

OBSTETRIC NURSES.

6 HE British Medical Association, which holds its Annual Meeting at Carlisle next

week, is to be asked to bestow a considerable amount of attention upon questions which intimately affect the Nursing profession. A gentleman, upon whose illogical utterances we have previously commented, proposes that the British Medical Association should practically rescind the important Resolution which it passed last year, at one of the largest and most influentially-attended meetings which the Association has ever held. His notice of motion reads as follows :—

"(a) That in the opinion of this meeting, inasmuch as Midwives or Midwifery Nurses cannot be dealt with on equal terms with other Nurses, no Bill is feasible which has for its object the 'Registration of all Nurses' with a common standard of education, and, if it were so, is not advisable.

"(b) This meeting is of opinion that the amended Bill of the Lancashire and Cheshire
