THE MORTUARY, HOSPITAL FOR SICK CHILDREN, GT. ORMOND STREET.

WE have before drawn attention to the Mortuary Chapel connected with the Children's Hospital, Great Ormond Street, as being the only Hospital Mortuary in London which comes up to our ideal of what such a place should be. The little Chapel has now been still further beautified. The ceiling, which is concave and semi-circular in form, has been re-painted, and the entire walls are now faced with veined marble, an addition which, from an artistic point of view, is admirable, while from, as sanitary precaution, nothing could be better. Beauty is not the only consideration in this On each occasion that we have Mortuary. visited it we have been impressed with the fact that, hygienically, the arrangements are excellent. There has been at least one body there on each of our visits, but it was impossible to detect the faintest suggestion of death in the fresh air of the Chapel. Those who know how difficult it is to keep a Mortuary sanitary will appreciate this fact. advise all our readers who are interested in Mortuary reform to pay a visit to the Hospital for Sick Children, Great Ormond Street, where we feel sure they will be accorded a courteous reception.

## THRIFT.

THE Junius S. Morgan Benevolent Fund—whose President is Lady Rothschild, and which is a branch of the Royal National Pension Fund—which has for its object the granting of loans or gifts to Matrons, Sisters, and Nurses needing such help, has lately received an addition to its funds.

The invested funds were, until lately, £11,000, but the Nurses of the Society have recently made an effort to increase this sum as a memento of the 60th year of the Queen's reign. As the result of their exertions, the substantial sum of £2,500 has been raised by them in donations, and this has been generously supplemented by a like sum from Mr. J.
