BLACKBURN UNION.—Election of SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.—The Guardians of the above Union will, at their meeting, to be held on Saturday, the 26th June, 1897, proceed to the election of a thoroughly-trained and certified Nurse to act as Superintendent Nurse at the Workhouse Infirmary.
