Miss B. A., Ealing.—Thank you for your letter. We hope that a public meeting will be held in the autumn at which there will be opportunity for free discussion; we quite

agree with you that no progress will be made towards a solution of the present difficulties in the Royal British Nurses' Association until it once more gives its adhesion to the principle of legal registration, publicly denied on its behalf by its representative at the Conference convened last year by the Parliamentary Bills Committee of the British Medical Association, and until also those matrons who were in 1895 deprived of their *ex officio* seats upon the General Council have been re-installed in them.

Probationer, Llandaff.—Obtain "Hoblyn's Dictionary of Medical Terms," price 10s. 6d., published by Whittaker & Co., Paternoster Row. You will find it most helpful to you.

Doubtful, Exeter.—In applying for a vacancy as a probationer, we advise you to make inquiries upon the following points: The length of training given, whether a certificate is given upon the expiration of the term of training, and whether the knowledge of nurses is tested by examination before the certificate is given, as the reputation of those schools which adopt a high standard naturally ranks highest. A full three years' training is now almost universally considered necessary as being the shortest period in which an adequate experience can be gained, consequently if you enter a hospital where a certificate is given at the end of a shorter period of training, you will find yourself handicapped in applying for many appointments.

Tired, London.—If you desire to obtain admission to the Sir Julian Goldsmid Home of Rest for Nurses, you should apply some little time before you desire to go there, as it is generally very full, more especially so at this time of the year. The terms are 15s. a week when a double-bedded room is occupied, or 21s. a week for a single room.
