

Sec. 4.—An Alumnae Association which shall fail to pay its dues for two (2) successive years shall cease to belong to this Association.

XII.—THE FISCAL YEAR.

The fiscal year shall extend from the end of one annual meeting to the beginning of the next.

XIII.—NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS.

The nomination of officers shall be made by a Nominating Committee, and a majority shall elect, and all elections shall be by ballot.

XIV.—AMENDMENTS.

Amendments to the Bye-laws of this Association may be effected by a majority vote at any meeting.

XV.—RULES OF ORDER.

The deliberation of all meetings of this Association shall be governed by the Woman's Manual of Parliamentary Law, by Harriet R. Shattuck.

A Suggested Nursing Act.

XXIV.—All Powers vested in the Privy Council by this Act may be exercised by any three or more of the Lords and others of the Privy Council, the Vice-President of the Committee of the said Privy Council on Education being one of them; and all Orders and Acts of the Privy Council under this Act shall be sufficiently made and signified by a written or printed Document, signed by one of the Clerks of the Privy Council, or such Officer as may be appointed by the Privy Council in this behalf; and all Orders and Acts made or signified by any written or printed Document purporting to be so signed shall be deemed to have been duly made, issued, and done by the Privy Council; and every such Document shall be received in evidence in all Courts, and before all Justices and others, without Proof of the Authority or Signature of such Clerk or other Officer or other Proof whatsoever, until it be shown that such Document was not duly signed by the Authority of the Privy Council.

XXV.—No Qualification shall be entered on the Register, either on the First Registration or by way of addition to a registered Name, unless the Registrar be satisfied by the proper evidence that the person claiming is entitled to it; and any Appeal from the decision of the Registrar shall be decided by the Executive Committee; and any Entry which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the said Executive Committee to have been fraudulently or incorrectly made may be erased from the Register by Order of the said Executive Committee.

XXVI.—The Registrar shall in every year cause to be printed, published, and sold, under the direction of the Nursing Council, a correct Register of the Names in alphabetical Order according to the Surnames, with the respective Residences, in the Form set forth in Schedule (C) to this Act, or to the like effect, and the Certificates or qualifications conferred by any Hospital or other Body, with the Dates thereof, of all Persons appearing on the Nursing Register as existing on the First Day of January in every Year; and such Register shall be called "The Nursing Register;" and a Copy of the Nursing Register for the time being, purporting to be so printed and published as aforesaid, shall be Evidence in all Courts and before all Justices of the Peace and others that the persons therein specified are registered according to the provisions of this Act; and the absence of the Name of any person from such Copy shall be Evidence, until the contrary be made to appear, that such person is not registered according to the provisions of this Act: Provided always, that in the case of any person whose Name does not appear in such Copy, a certified Copy, under the hand of the Registrar of the Nursing Council, of the Entry of the Name of such person on the Nursing Register shall be Evidence that such person is registered under the provisions of this Act.

XXVII.—If any of the Hospitals at any Time exercise any power they possess by Law of striking off from the List of such Hospitals the name of any one of their Certificated Nurses, such Hospital shall signify to the Nursing Council the Name of the Nurse so struck off; and the Nursing Council may, if they see fit, direct the Registrar to erase forthwith from the Register the Qualification, derived from such Hospital, in respect of which such Nurse was registered, and the Registrar shall note the same therein.

XXVIII.—If any registered Nurse shall be convicted of any Felony or Misdemeanor, or shall after due inquiry be judged by the Executive Committee to have been guilty of infamous conduct in any professional respect, the said Executive Committee may, if they see fit, direct the Registrar to erase the Name of such Nurse from the Register.

XXIX.—Every person registered under this Act who may have obtained any higher or any Qualification other than the Qualification in respect of which he or she may have been registered, shall be entitled to have such higher or additional Qualification inserted in the Register in substitution for, or in addition to, the Qualification previously registered, on payment of such Fee as the Council may appoint.

XXX.—Every Person registered under this Act shall be entitled according to his or her
