KINGSTON-UPON-HULL INCORPORATION FOR THE POOR.—Appointment of CHARGE NURSE and PROBATIONERS.

The Governor and Guardians of the above Incorporation require the services of a CHARGE NURSE at their Workhouse Hospital.

Salary £25 per annum, with rations, apartments, uniform, and washing, and an allowance of one shilling per week in lieu of beer.

Candidates must not exceed 40 years of age, and be single women, or widows without children, and must hold a recognised general hospital or infirmary certificate.

The officer appointed will be required to act as Night Nurse in turn.

The Guardians also require the services of six young women as PROBATIONERS, at their Workhouse Hospital.

Age from 20 to 30 years. Three years training. Salary: First year, £10; second year, £15; third year, £20; with uniform, rations, apartments, and washing. Candidates will be required to act for three months on approval, and, if satisfactory, this term will be included in the first year's service.

Applications for either the position of Charge Nurse or Probationer, in candidates' own handwriting, must be made on printed forms, to be obtained on personal application at my office, or by forwarding an addressed, stamped foolscap envelope, and these, accompanied by not more than three copy testimonials of recent date, must be sent to me, endorsed "Nurse," or "Probationer," as the case may be, not later than noon on Monday, the 6th day of September next.

The appointments will be made subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, and to the provisions of the Poor-Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, and the Amendment Act, 1897.

The officers appointed will be required to produce certificate of registry of birth, and to submit to medical examination by the Medical Officer of the Workhouse before entering upon their duties.

Selected candidates will have notice to attend when required, and reasonable travelling expenses will be allowed.

Canvassing the Guardians will be deemed a disqualification.
