KINGSTON-UPON-HULL INCORPORATION FOR THE POOR—SUPERINTENDENT NURSE AND MALE AND FEMALE NURSES.—The Guardians of the Kingston-upon-Hull Incorporation for the Poor require the services of a Superintendent Nurse, and also of a Male and Female Nurse for their Workhouse Hospital.

The appointments will be made subject to the approval of the Local Government Board and to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Acts, 1896 and 1897.

Candidates for the appointment of Superintendent Nurse must be single women or widows, not exceeding 40 years of age, without children dependent upon them, and must be qualified for the appointment by having undergone, for three years at least, a course of instruction in the medical and surgical wards of any hospital or infirmary, being a training school for nurses, and maintaining a resident physician or house surgeon, and must also be certificated in Midwifery.

Candidates for the appointment of Male and Female Nurse must be husband and wife between 25 and 40 years of age, without children dependent upon them.

The Salary of the Superintendent Nurse will be £40 per annum, and of the Male and Female Nurses £30 and £25 per annum respectively, in each case with furnished apartments, rations, washing, and 1s. per week in lieu of beer. Uniform dress for indoor wear will be provided for the Female Nurses.
