Appointment of SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.—The Guardians of the above Union invite applications for the appointment of Superintendent Nurse at their Workhouse Hospital at Chesterfield.

The appointment will be made subject to the approval of the Local Government Board and to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, and Amendment Act, 1897.

Candidates must be single women, or widows without children dependent on them, and must be qualified for the appointment by having undergone for three years a course of instruction in the medical and surgical wards of a hospital or infirmary being a training school for nurses and maintaining a resident physician or house surgeon, and must also be certificated in midwifery.

It will be the duty of the person appointed to superintend the other nurses in the hospital in the performance of their duties, subject in all matters of the treatment of the sick to the direction of the Medical Officer, and on all other matters to the directions of the Master and Matron of the Workhouse, and the person appointed will be required to do all the work of a Day Nurse in the Infirmary.

The average number of patients is 90, and there are three other nurses.

The salary will be after the rate of £35 per annum, with furnished apartments, washing, rations, uniform, and 1s. per week in lieu of beer.
