## Work at Jerusalem.

THE British Ophthalmic Hospital at Jerusalem, which belongs to the Grand Priory of the Order of the Hospital of S. John of Jerusalem, in England, is an institution which takes a high position amongst the charities of the Order. Those who have any knowledge of the terrible amount of eye disease in Eastern countries will know that such a hospital must be an unqualified blessing to thousands of sufferers. That the benefits which it confers are appreciated, is evidenced by the fact that last year the applications for admission were 1,124, as against 937 in the previous year; and in six months the admissions were 569, as against 368. The new out-patients 4,640, as against 3,757, the attendances on out-patients 12,881 as against 9,468; the operations (in six months) 1,277 as against 890. It is therefore the more to be deplored that the Committee report that there has been no corresponding increase of pecuniary support, and that the deficit in the accounts of the hospital has only been diminished by economy carried to the verge of parsimony, and of such a character as even to threaten a deterioration of efficiency. As patients are received from all parts of Palestine, and it is patent that if the Hospital were four or five times its present size it would be more than fully supplied with patients, it is much to be hoped that when the needs of this excellent institution are made known, the work will not be allowed to suffer for lack of funds.
