SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.

DUDLEY UNION.—APPOINTMENT OF "SUPERINTENDENT NURSE."—The Guardians of the above Union will, at their meeting to be holden on Friday, the 21st October instant, consider Applications for the Appointment of a "Superintendent Nurse" for their Workhouse Infirmary.
The salary will be £32 per annum, rising £1 annually to £35 per annum, with furnished apartments, rations (exclusive of beer), laundry, and uniform.
The appointment will be made subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, and to the Provisions of the Poor-law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1866, and the Amendment Act, 1897.

The person appointed must have undergone, for at least three years, a course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of a duly recognised Training School for Nurses, in accordance with the recent order of the Local Government Board relating to the Nursing of Sick in Workhouses.
