BRIDGWATER UNION WORKHOUSE.—FEMALE CERTIFICATED SUPERINTENDENT NURSE, AND ASSISTANT NURSE.—Wanted, a Female Certificated Superintendent Nurse for the sick and infirm wards of above Workhouse, who will have two Assistants under her.
