SUPERINTENDENT NURSE.

BEDWELLY UNION.—SUPERINTENDENT NURSE Wanted.—The Guardians of the Bedwelly Union require the services of a Superintendent Nurse at their Workhouse, who has undergone for three years at least a course of instruction in the medical and surgical wards of any hospital or infirmary being a training school for nurses, and maintaining a resident or house-surgeon.

The salary will be £30 per annum, with board, lodging, and washing (but no allowance for beer.)

The appointment will be subject to the approval of the Local Government Board, and to the provision of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, and the Amendment Act, 1897, for which purpose the emoluments are assessed at £35 per annum.

Candidates must be single women or widows without encumbrance and be between the ages of 25 and 40.

Applications, in the candidate's own handwriting must reach me not later than Tuesday the 3rd January, 1899, stating age, experience, place of training, and the certificate held, and must be accompanied by copies of not more than three testimonials of recent date, endorsed "Superintendent Nurse."
