Editorial.

THE INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF WOMEN.

THE International Council of Women, under whose auspices the great International Congress is to be held in June, is preeminently an Association of Associations. "Individuals connect themselves with the International body, not as units, not even through local associations, but only by virtue of their membership in national organizations which have come into official membership in the National Council of the country of which they are citizens. It is strictly a delegate body where ideas, not individuals, are represented."

At the root of the formation of the International Council, and the secret of its success, lies this great principle, the Co-operation of Women. First, there is the union of individuals into Societies formed for definite objects, next, the affiliation of the Societies with the National Councils, and, finally, the federation of the various National Councils into the great International Body, with the objects of securing "the co-operation of women in various countries, irrespective of race or creed, in this movement for the promotion of sisterly understanding, sympathy, and love."
