#### CHARGE NURSES.

HACKNEY UNION.—CERTIFIED MIDWIFERY NURSES and CHARGE NURSES.

The Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting, to be held on Wednesday, the 26th April, 1899, proceed to the election of the following officers for their Infirmary at Homerton, N.E., viz.:

Certified MIDWIFERY NURSES.

CHARGE NURSES.

The salary assigned to each of the above offices is £30 per annum, rising £1 annually to a maximum of £36 per annum, together with rations, washing, lodging, and uniform clothing.

The Charge Nurse must have had at least three years' training in a public hospital or an infirmary, being a training school for Nurses, and must hold a certificate of proficiency in Nursing.

The Midwifery Nurses must hold a certificate of the London Obstetrical Society, and preference will be given to candidates who have had experience in Hospital Nursing, and hold a certificate of proficiency therein.

The above appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, the Amendment Act, 1897, and to the approval of the Local Government Board.

Candidates must be single and must have attained the age of 21 years.

Personally canvassing the Guardians will disqualify a candidate.

Printed forms, upon which application must be made, can be obtained at my office, or one will be sent upon receipt of a stamped addressed foolscap envelope.
