#### CHARGE NURSES.

## HACKNEY UNION,—CHARGE NURSE WANTED.

The Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting, to be held on Wednesday, May 10th, 1899, proceed to the election of a Charge Nurse for the Infirmary of their schools at Brentwood, Essex.

Salary £30 per annum, rising £1 annually to a maximum salary of £36 per annum together with rations, washing, lodging, and uniform clothing.
