ASSISTANT MATRON.

HACKNEY UNION.—ASSISTANT MATRON WANTED.

The Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting, to be held on the 16th August, 1899, proceed to the election of an Assistant Matron for their Infirmary, High Street, Homerton, N.E.

Salary £40 per annum, rising £2 annually until a maximum of £50 per annum is reached, together with rations (no beer), washing, lodging, and uniform clothing.

Candidates for the above appointment must be single, and must have had at least three years' training in a Public Hospital or an Infirmary, being a Training School for Nurses, and must hold a certificate of proficiency in Nursing, and will be required to perform the duties of Matron during the Matron's temporary absence.

Personally canvassing the Guardians will disqualify a candidate.

The appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, to the approval of the Local Government Board, and to the Nursing Regulations in force for the time being at the Infirmary.
