Comments and Replies.

Mrs. Plummer.—You cannot do better than procure the Text Book of Anatomy and Physiology for Nurses, compiled by Miss Diana C. Kimber, Graduate of Belle Vue Training School, New York, and until recently Assistant Superintendent, New York City Training School, Blackwell's Island, published by Macmillan and Co., and Hoblyn's Dictionary of Medical Terms, published by Whittaker and Co., Paternoster Square. Both are most acceptable gifts for a nurse.

Miss E. P.—Your best plan is to write to the Matron of the Hospital you wish to enter, and ask for an appointment. The Matrons of most of the large hospitals have fixed times for interviewing intending probationers. You should obtain the "Nursing Directory," published at the Offices of the NURSING RECORD, price 5s., and study the regulations of

the training schools; do not be tempted to enter any school for a term of two years, on account of obtaining a certificate sooner. What is of importance is the value of the certificate when obtained, and you will find that in order to obtain most desirable appointments, the possession of a three years' certificate is a necessity.

Private Nurse.—If milk for any reason is unobtainable, an excellent egg flip may be made by using two eggs instead of one, and adding to them sufficient soda water to fill the glass, with the addition of half an ounce of good brandy and some crushed ice. The ice not only increases the palatability of the mixture, but definitely increases its stimulating properties.
