### Editorial.

"THE VOTE COVERS ALL."

HE lines which Asylum News suggests should be pursued by Asylum workers in relation to Lunacy Legislation and the question of pensions is noteworthy. Referring to the successful result of the action of the staff of the Leicester Asylum in passing a resolution on this subject and communicating it to their local member our contemporary says-"We venture to say that if every public asylum in the country would act in the same manner, the Government would have no option but to grant a satisfactory pension clause in spite of the opposition of the County Councils Associations, which has apparently been the bugbear in the mind of the Lord Chancellor, whose original intentions in the matter of pensions were quite satisfactory. The necessity for certain administrative alterations in the Lunacy Law makes it pretty certain that a Lunacy Bill of some sort will be re-introduced next Session. The interval should be utilized by our members in making their representatives in Parliament acquainted with their views, and putting them in a more pointed form than heretofore before the Lord Chancellor."
