### MATRON.

**THE BLABY AND WIGSTON MAGNA JOINT HOSPITAL COMMITTEE, Leicestershire.**—APPOINTMENT OF MATRON, STAFF NURSE, PROBATIONERS, and WARDMAIDS.

The above Joint Committee invite applications for the following appointments to their Infectious Hospital:—

**MATRON.**—Candidates must be single women, or widows without encumbrance, and not less than thirty years of age.

The salary will be £70, with board, lodging, and washing (no uniform). The person appointed must have been properly trained and certificated, and have had experience in fever nursing and housekeeping, and will, under the direction of the Medical Superintendent, be held responsible for the management of the hospital, and must be competent to keep the various books. She will be required to enter upon her duties as early as possible.

**STAFF NURSE.**—Must be trained and certificated, not less than twenty-five years of age, and competent to instruct probationers. Single woman, or a widow without encumbrance, to act under the direction of the Matron. Duties to commence forthwith.

Salary £40, with board, lodging, and washing (no uniform).

**TWO PROBATIONERS.**—Salary £12, with board, lodging, and washing (no uniforms). They will be required to enter into agreements for two years' service.

**THREE WARDMAIDS.**—Salary £16, with board, lodging, and washing (no uniforms).

## HACKNEY UNION.—CHARGE NURSE Wanted.

The Guardians of this Union will, at their meeting to be held on Wednesday, the 20th day of December, 1899, proceed to the election of a **CHARGE NURSE** for their Infirmary at Homerton.

Salary £30 per annum, rising £1 annually to a maximum salary of £36 per annum, together with rations (no beer), lodging, washing, and uniform clothing.

The appointment will be subject to the provisions of the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, the Amendment Act, 1897, and to the approval of Local Government Board.

Candidates must have had at least three years' training in a Public Hospital or an Infirmary, being a Training School for Nurses, and must hold a certificate of proficiency in Nursing.

Candidates for the above appointment must be single, and must have attained the age of 21 years.
