

### Nurses of Note.

THE accompanying picture, which we have much pleasure in printing, is of Miss Keating, the Superintendent of Nurses at the Erie County

Hospital, Buffalo, New York State, and President for the present year of the American Society of Superintendents of Training Schools for Nurses. She entered the General Hospital, Buffalo, for training on January 1st, 1890, and graduated in the 1892 class. After graduation she was appointed Head Nurse in the women's department, where she remained for six months. In November, 1892, she was appointed head of the training school for nurses connected with the Union Benevolent Association Hospital, of

Grand Rapids, Michigan, but at the end of a year was compelled to relinquish the work on account of failing health. The following summer a children's hospital for cholera infantum (a summer hospital) was opened at Athol Springs, N.Y., on the lake shore, ten miles from Buffalo,

and Miss Keating was appointed its first Superintendent and Matron. After her work there she was engaged in private nursing for a year, and at the end of that time, in November, 1895, she was appointed to the position which she now holds, that of Superintendent of the Erie County

Hospital, the largest hospital in Buffalo. Miss Keating is keenly interested in all efforts for the better training and organization of nurses, and is a warm supporter of the three years' curriculum for nurses which is now being widely adopted by the leading training schools in the United States, in place of the two years' course, as she considers that many educational advantages are obtainable in the third year. Miss Keating, besides holding the position of President of the American Society of Superintendents of Training School for Nurses, is a member of the Nurses' National Associated Alumnæ, and also of three local Associations. Foreign members of the International Congress of Nurses will look forward with pleasure to making her acquaintance next year.
