under the impulse of motives that we hardly understand, and dominated by superstitions which we no longer share.

It has a quality of originality and of fascination which will certainly enslave the reader; if read upon a holiday in the less frequented parts of Wales, it should prove potent as a spell to recapture a vanished past. G. M. R.
