## The Society for State Registration of Trained Murses.

At a Meeting of the Registration Committee of the Matrons' Council, held on the 21st inst., Miss M. Breay, Hon. Sec., reported "that since the last meeting when 209 applications for membership of the Society for State Registration of Trained Nurses were accepted, 110 more applications have been received.

Miss Mulvany, Matron of the Bolton Infirmary and Dispensary, has accepted the position of Local Hon. Secretary for Bolton, Lancashire, Miss Helen Pearse for Staffordshire, Miss Gertrude Knight for Nottinghamshire, and Miss S. E. Polden for Somersetshire, and a great number of letters in warm sympathy with the movement and offering help in arousing local interest have been received."

An interesting letter from Miss H. Todd, Bournemouth, addressed to the Committee, was read, touching on the important question of nursing in special and small hospitals, and kindred institutions, and recommending careful consideration of their interests by co-operative training-or some form of affiliation with the larger trainingschools-in any scheme for State Registration for Nurses which might ultimately be put forward. It was generally accepted that by co-operation Matrons and Nurses might so take counsel together, that the interests of every branch of Nursing might be represented by experts, who had personal experience of the various difficulties and interests concerned—for this purpose the new Society had been formed, and by the appointment of Local Hon. Secretaries it was hoped that, following the example of Miss Todd, special information would be placed at the disposal of the Executive Committee, which it was proposed to appoint at the Meeting in May. It was hoped that in a multitude of councillors, wisdom would be found. The question of the · State Registration of Nurses was recognised to be full of difficulties, therefore the sooner an influential body of trained Nurses came together to thresh it out, the sooner a satisfactory solution would be found.
