EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The names of influential lay women and trained nurses were then proposed to form an Executive Committee, subject to their consent to act, it being thought wiser not to invite gentlemen to take seats on this Committee until at least 2,000 nurses had proved their interest in the question of State Registration by becoming members of the Society, when it was hoped that men with legal, medical, and Parliamentary knowledge would consent to help trained nurses to bring the matter of their legal status before Parliament.

The meeting then terminated.
