## Educational Questions.

### PREPARATORY COURSE FOR NURSES' TRAINING-SCHOOLS.

DREXEL INSTITUTE, PHILADELPHIA.

The rapid development of training-schools for nurses in this country has led of late to serious discussion as to the kind and amount of scientific education which ought to be given to the nurses in training. The question has been before the American Society of Superintendents of Training-Schools for Nurses, and the drift of opinion is evidently in favour of increasing the amount and raising the standard of the instruction given in those studies, which might be characterised as auxiliary to the strictly professional training given in the hospitals. The conviction among those who have given the matter special attention appears to be that this scientific knowledge could be more advantageously acquired if given independently of the professional work; and the general conclusion which has been reached is that if a preparatory course of training in the scientific branches, a knowledge of which is essential to a fully-equipped nurse, should be provided; relief from the pressure upon the women in the first year of the training-schools would be obtained, while the standard for the education of nurses would be raised along the whole line.

At the solicitation of Dr. S. Weir Mitchell and the Superintendents of the leading nurses' training-schools, Philadelphia, the Drexel Institute has undertaken to organise such a preparatory course of instruction. The Institute has all the necessary facilities in the way of laboratories, lecture-rooms, class-rooms, school-kitchens, apparatus, and appliances, and all the additions necessary for this new course of instruction and training will be liberally provided.
