### The Metropolitan Nursing Association.

The annual meeting of the Metropolitan Nursing Association was held on Monday last at Grosvenor House, by permission of the Duke of Westminster. Princess Christian, who is President of the Association, presided. Amongst those present were Mrs. Dick-Cunyngham, in attendance on her Royal Highness, the Rev. Dacre Craven, the Rev. R. J. Campbell, Mr. H. Bonham Carter (Vice-Chairman of Executive Committee), and Dr. Oswald Browne.

The chief objects of the Association are to train and provide skilled nurses to nurse the sick poor in their own homes, and to supply trained district nurses primarily to the Queen Victoria's Jubilee Institute for Nurses and its affiliated associations.

During the year, twenty-eight trained nurses were received into the home for special training in district work. The seventeen who completed their training received appointments in associations affiliated to the Institute. The main part of the cost of training is borne by the Institute, while the expense of providing nursing for the local sick poor is met by subscribers and donors to the Association. The statement of accounts showed that the Association had an income of £1,604, and its expenditure was £1,609.

The adoption of the report was moved by Mr. Bonham Carter and seconded by Mr. Harold Boulton. A resolution was proposed by the Rev. R. J. Campbell pledging the meeting to support the Association. The speaker said there was no more deserving charity, and it only needed to have its claims more widely known to elicit the sympathy of the public. This was seconded by Dr. Oswald Browne, and the meeting terminated after the usual votes of thanks had been passed.
