Mrs. Fenwick then reported the progress which had been made since the last meeting, and considerable time was devoted to the discussion of the best methods of future organisation.

Progress of State Registration.

The Pennsylvania State Association of Graduate Nurses is to be warmly congratulated upon the progress it has made during its short existence. The Society has for its object the "promotion of the welfare and the upholding of the honour of the nursing profession, for the benefit of the public which it serves." During the past few months it has circularised every nurse in the State, pointing out the reason for co operation. The first step is the establishment of a standard of education, fitness, and ability for nurses, and, through legi-lation, the maintenance of such a standard. A Bill for the Registration of Nurses has been drafted, and is to be introduced at the next Session of the State Legislature.

It is significant that the Matrons of all the nursetraining schools of any influence in the State are unanimously in favour of providing for the registering of graduate trained nurses. Moreover, the leading medical men and hospital authorities are giving sympathetic support to the nurses in their efforts to improve their education and professional standing, and thus the benefit of the sick in the State of Pennsylvania. The attempted Russification of the nursing world in Great Britain evidently finds no parallel in a free country such as the United States.
