Progress of State Registration.

The two Registration Bills—one (the Nurses Registration Bill) introduced into the House of Commons by Mr. Munro Ferguson on behalf of the Society for the State Registration of Trained Nurses, the other by Mr. Claude Hay (for the Registration of Nurses and Private Nursing Homes) on behalf of the Royal British Nurses' Association—are down for their second reading next week, the latter on May 8th, the former on May 9th. Mr. McKenna and Mr. Harry Lawson have given notice that they will oppose the Nurses' Bill.

The Select Committee to consider the expediency of providing for the Registration of Trained Nurses will meet for the first time after the Easter recess on Thursday, May 11th, at 11.30 a.m., when the first witness will be Mrs. Bedford Fenwick.

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Society for the State Registration of Trained Nurses was held on Wednesday, May 3rd, at 431, Oxford Street, London, W., when the arrangements for the Annual Meeting were made. The date was fixed for Friday, May 26th, at the Medical Society's Rooms, 11, Chandos Street, London, W., at 3 p.m. A report of this meeting, with list of new members elected, will appear in our next issue.

The Financiers' Registration Scheme.

The Board of Trade have fixed Friday, May 5th, to hear objections to the granting of a Licence to the Incorporated Society for Promoting the Higher Education of Nurses to incorporate without the word "Limited."
