Matron of the Ruchill Fever Hospital, Glasgow.

Miss H. G. Langles, Matron of the Ruchill Fever Hospital, Glasgow, whose portrait we have pleasure in publishing on this page, is a lady who has had wide experience to qualify her for the important position to which she has now been appointed, and step by step since the day when she entered the Western Infirmary, Glasgow for training, she has steadily worked her way up the professional ladder until she has attained her present influential position.

After obtaining the certificate of her Training School Miss Langles worked as a private nurse in Bournemouth, thus gaining an experience which is invaluable to all nurses. She was then invited to return to the Western Infirmary, Glasgow, as Sister in the out-patient and electrical department, and after having held this position for three years she was appointed Sister in Sir Hector Cameron's wards, and later Night Superintendent; for a time

she also acted as Housekeeper, thus gaining an insight into the management of the commissariat department of the utmost value to her in her subsequent work.

Miss Langles' career at the Western Infirmary, terminated when she accepted the post of Matron of the Ochil Hills Sanatorium which was offered to her. Here she organised and

opened the nursing department, and retained the position of Matron until appointed to that of Matron of the Knightswood Fever Hospital, Partick, near Glasgow, which she is now resigning. She has thus had excellent preparation for the duties of the important post to which she has now been appointed as Matron of the Ruchill Hospital.

It is a matter of rejoicing to Glasgow nurses that the new Matron of its fine fever hospital was not only trained but born and bred in Glasgow.

The nursing schools connected with the Glasgow general hospitals have a high reputation for efficiency, and the Governing Body of the Ruchill Hospital is to be congratulated on recognising this fact, and appointing as its Matron a Glasgow trained lady.
