THE REPORT OF THE HON. SECRETARY.

After the Minutes were read and confirmed, the Hon. Secretary presented a Report dealing with the quarter's work, in which she said that the Petition to the Prime Minister, respectfully pleading that a Bill for the State Registration of Trained Nurses might be made a Government Measure, had been widely signed by trained nurses, and that the Medical Superintendents, Matrons, and a very large number of mental nurses in Asylums had supported the Petition.

MEDICAL SUPPORT.

The return of Dr. Langley Browne at the head of the poll in the election of Direct Representatives of the Medical Profession on the General Medical Council, afforded ground for congratulation Dr. Browne had rendered good service to the Registration Cause, and was always to be relied upon to advance its

Dr. MacManus, the other successful candidate, was also in favour of Nurses' Registration.

It was with very great regret that the Hon. Secretary recorded the death of Mr. A. W. Black, M.P., W.S., who succumbed to injuries he received in the Arbroath railway disaster. On each occasion Mr. Black had backed the Bill, and in other ways proved himself a good friend of the Registration Cause.

THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT.

The Hon. Secretary reported that the Society was solvent largely owing to the generous support of friends—the annual shilling sub-scription was not paid as regularly as it ought

THANKS TO MR. R. C. MUNRO-FERGUSON, M.P. A warm vote of thanks was passed to Mr. Munro-Ferguson, M.P., for his services in connection with the cause of State Registration of Nurses.
