Mrs. Kildare Treacy, who is now President of the Irish Nurses' Association, is an Irishwoman, her county being "Gallant Tipperary," and she acknowledges with pride that she has received her training as a hospital nurse in Ireland. £1,000 as a foundation for it, and most of whom were members of the eminent medical and surgical staff of the hospital, with the Right Hon. Gerald FitzGibbon, Lord Justice of Appeal, a Director of the Hospital, as the Chair man.

The Institution supplied all expenses of the support of the nurses,
