Her Majesty the Queen has nominated Adeline Duchess of Bedford as President of Queen Alexandra's Committee in connection with the Queen Victoria's Jubilee Institute, in succession to the late Countess Cadogan, who took a warm interest in its work. It will be remembered that last year this Committee, authorised by the Queen, which was appointed with the object of raising £2,000 towards the expenditure of the Institute for 1906, satisfactorily accomplished its task, each member undertaking to be responsible for £100. Her Majesty, while expressing her thanks to the Committee through its President, and her satisfaction with the amount raised, said that she felt it would not be possible to trespass on the kindness of these ladies by asking them to collect so large an amount in future, and approved a scheme inviting 200 ladies each to guarantee £10 a year. Owing to the lamented death of Lady Cadogan, this list of 200 names has so far not been completed, but it is hoped now that the full number may be shortly submitted to her Majesty for her approval.
