A DEFICIENT MILK SUPPLY.

At a recent meeting of the Committee of the Bedford County Hospital Mrs. Alfred Paine brought forward a practical point to which our attention has already been drawn. She said that in all the villages the County Council lecturers had been advising mothers to feed their children on milk; but the milk could not be found, and if it were the mothers could not pay for it. It was no good to teach mothers what to do if they could not help them. She went to a village with a lecturer, and the mothers went to her and said they could not get milk for themselves. She asked how the difficulty was to be met. Mrs. Paine is eminently practical, and it is well known that from many country villages the bulk of the milk is sent up to town, so that it is most difficult to obtain. It is no use to give instruction, however theoretically sound, without considering how it can be carried out practically.
