

### Practical Points.

By the kindness of Mr. A. E. Johnson, M.B., F.R.C.S., late Surgical Registrar to the Royal Infirmary, Manchester, we are able to give the accompanying illustration of a face-screen (Fig. 1) made under his direction by Messrs. T. Armstrong and Brother,

Deansgate, Manchester. Mr. Johnson considers combined face-screens and caps uncomfortable. A screen to be cool must be open at the sides and hang loosely. He suggests a length of gauze four-



fold thick doubled over a frame, and still long enough to hang free from the face when tucked inside the operating apron. Fig. 2 shows the modified spectacle frame used for the purpose.
