Appointments.

LADY SUPERINTENDENTS.

Manchester Royal Infirmary.—Miss Margaret Elwin Sparshott has been appointed Lady Superintendent of Nurses. She was trained and certificated at the General Hospital, Nottingham, from 1892 to 1895, and was promoted to be Sister, a position she held for two years, when she was appointed Night Superintendent at the General Hospital, Birmingham, where she remained for nearly three years, nine months of which time she acted as Assistant Matron. Miss Sparshott was then elected Matron of the Grimsby and District Hospital, where she remained three years, until promoted to be Matron of the Derbyshire Royal Infirmary, a position she resigns after four years' admirable work. We are pleased to note that the responsible post at the "M.R.I." has been given to a lady trained in a leading provincial nursing school.

Mercer's Hospital, Dublin.—Miss Eileen F. Beamish has been appointed Lady Superintendent. She was trained at the Manchester Chest and Throat Hospital, and at the Royal Infirmary, Bradford, where she was gold medallist of her year, and held the post of sister. Miss Beamish has also been attached to the Yorkshire Co-operation for Nurses and Nursing Homes, Leeds, and has held the position of Sister at the National Hospital for Consumption, Newcastle, co. Wicklow, and Lady Superintendent of the Institution of Trained Nurses, Leicester.
