Irish Nurses' Association.

A special meeting of the members of the Executive Committee took place on Saturday evening, Jan. 30, at 86, Lower Leeson Street, Dublin. This was to consider the best mode of action to take now to ensure the Nurses' Bill receiving early attention by the Government.

Miss Kelly, Matron, Steevens' Hospital, was in the chair. Present: Miss MacDonnell, R.R.C., Matron, Richmond, Whitworth, and Hardwicke Hospitals; Miss Huxley, Matron, Elpis Private Hospital, former Matron, Sir Patrick Dun's Hospital and past President, Irish Nurses' Association; Miss Haughton, Matron, Sir Patrick Dun's Hospital; Miss Sutton, Matron, St. Vincent's Hospital; Miss Lamont, Superintendent, Q.V.J.N.I., Vice-President; Miss Carson-Rae, Matron, Cork Street Fever Hospital; Miss West, Matron, Protestant Infirmary, North Dublin Union; Mrs. Manning, Matron of the Dental Hospital;

and Mrs. Kildare-Treacy, Superintendent, City of Dublin Nursing Institution, Hon. Sec. to Sub-Committee appointed by the Irish Nurses' Association to deal with their interests as to State Registration. Many others were prevented from being present.

Miss Huxley read letters and Memo. from Mrs. Bedford Fenwick to the President (Miss Lucy Ramsden, Matron, Rotunda Hospital, at present absent in London), respecting the action advised by the State Registration Society, and Mrs. Kildare Treacy, who had recently been in London, gave detailed particulars of her interviews there on the same subject. This was as to getting the Bill through the Commons; and Mrs. Treacy also said she had recently received advice on the same subject from some Irish M.P.'s.

After some discussion as to the course advisable in the interests of the Irish Nurses' Association, the following resolution was proposed by Miss Huxley (Senior Vice-President of the State Registration Society), and seconded by Miss MacDonnell, R.R.C., and supported by Miss Sutton (St. Vincent's Hospital):—

"That, in the opinion of the Irish Nurses' Association, the Government should take up, and immediately introduce, the Nurses' Registration Bill, which passed through the House of Lords *nemine contradicente* last Session, as a non-contentious measure."

This resolution was unanimously passed, and it was further proposed by Miss MacDonnell, R.R.C., seconded by Miss Carson-Rae, and supported by Miss Haughton, and also unanimously resolved, that copies of the above resolution be forwarded to the Prime Minister and the Chief Secretary for Ireland.

The whole tone of the meeting was most hopeful, and all present seemed more impressed than ever, with the necessity for their using prompt and decisive action, so as to secure the passage of the Bill, which will bestow untold advantages both on the Nursing Profession, as coadjutors to the Medical Profession, and as servants to the public.
