At the Annual Convention of the American Woman Suffrage Association, at Seattle, the President, Miss Anna Shaw, declared that never was there such a magnificent outlook for the cause, and that opportunities were increasing beyond their ability to furnish workers. Previously a resolution was adopted congratulating the women of Great Britain on their gallant fight for the franchise. The announcement was also made of the practical completion of the work of collecting 1,000,000 signatures for the petition to Congress urging an amendment of the Constitution enabling women to vote.
