LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL.

At the meeting of the London County Council on Tuesday the Public Control Committee reported that, in connection with the staff of Infant Protection Visitors under the Children Act, they had had 74 applications for two vacancies, most of which came from School Nurses in the Public Health Department. They recommended the appointment of Miss M. M. Keohane and Miss M. E. Lockington, School Nurses, and that the seal of the Council be affixed to warrants of authority indicating that they have been appointed by the Council as Infant Protection Visitors.

MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES AT JOHANNESBURG HOSPITAL.

A notable feature of the presentation of medals and certificates at the Johannesburg Hospital is always the report of the Lady Superintendent on the Nursing Staff of the Hospital, and that presented by Mrs. Magill, covering the period from January 1st, 1910, to June 30th, 1911, gives many interesting details. Amongst the changes due to promotions, Sister Macmanaway has been appointed Matron of the Miners' Phthisis Sanatorium at Sprinkall, Sister Turner, Matron of the Queen Victoria Hospital for Women, and four more Sisters have assumed duties elsewhere, while one left to be married. Nineteen Staff Nurses also tendered their resignations during this period, 13 to take up other appointments, 5 to be married, and 1 on account of ill health.

In connection with the junior examinations, 32 candidates entered and 26 passed. Silver medals were awarded to Sister St. Julienne and Nurse Evans with equal honours.

In the senior examination 16 candidates entered and all passed, the Gold Medal being won by Nurse Kisch.
