QUEEN VICTORIA'S JUBILEE INSTITUTE FOR NURSES.

AS a number of Nurses and intending Nurses may be interested, we have much pleasure in publishing the regulations as to the training and engagement of District Nurses for the sick poor:—

I.—TRAINING.

1.—The following qualifications as to training, approved by the Council, shall be considered requisite to render a Nurse eligible to be placed on the roll of those to be submitted to the Queen for her approval:—

- (a) Training in some approved General Hospital, or Infirmary, for not less than one year.
- (b) Approved training in District Nursing for not less than six months, including the nursing of mothers and their infants after childbirth.
- (c) Nurses in country districts must in addition have at least three months' approved training in midwifery.

These conditions are subject to modification by the Council to meet exceptional cases.

Nurses already trained, and belonging to an Association already affiliated to the Institute, may

be eligible if they afford satisfactory evidence of competency.

2.—In order to provide the required six months' training in District Nursing, the Council have made arrangements with the Metropolitan and National Nursing Association, London, for the admission to their Homes of a limited number of Probationers already qualified, according to the above condition (a); and they are making similar arrangements with other District Nursing Associations in London and elsewhere.

3.—A Candidate desiring admission as a Probationer should apply, by letter only, to the Secretary, Queen Victoria's Jubilee Institute for Nurses, St. Katharine's Royal Hospital, Regent's Park, N.W.; or to the Superintendent of the Metropolitan and National Nursing Association, 23, Bloomsbury Square, W.C.; or to the Superintendent of the Scottish Branch, 29, Castle Terrace, Edinburgh; or to the Superintendent of any of the other Associations with which the Council may have made arrangements for training, whose addresses will be supplied by the Secretary of the Queen Victoria's Jubilee Institute for Nurses.
