Osborn Hall maintains not only a Registry, but a Nurses' Shop, a restaurant and a laundry for its members, as well as an Assembly Hail. In this Hall weekly teas are arranged, and on the third Thursday of each month the Association holds a business meeting. It takes an active interest in all movements and public questions concerning the nursing of the sick and the general welfare of nurses, and in addition to a yearly report of its work, publishes a quarterly magazine, containing articles prepared by

Travelling scholarships are now a great need in the nursing profession, and it is greatly hoped that the Isla Stewart Memorial may ultimately take this educational form.

The important outcome of these experiences lies in a heightened and discriminative mutual regard, together with an overhauling and practical review of one's mental storehouse and craftsmanship, that may prove to be the strongest stimulus of years—perhaps of a lifetime." The advantages of foreign travel to nurses are equally great, and not the least of the benefits of the International Council of Nurses are the opportunities it affords for obtaining acquaintance with foreign countries and peoples.
