are as yet no local branches. The Executive Committee elects the members and they will receive invitations to meetings in London, notices, &c., direct from the Central Office, and as far as possible will be transferred to local branches as soon as these are formed.

NEW BRANCHES.

Four new branches were reported as having been started since the last Council Meeting in April, and negotiations are in progress in several other places.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR LONDON.

The Council has accepted the suggestion of the London Board that all members of the Union in London shall be united into one London Branch, directly affiliated to the Council, and for the present to be worked from the Central Office. Miss Alsop, Matron of the Kensington Infirmary, remains Hon. Treasurer for London, and Miss Ashley has been elected Branch Secretary for London. LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD, SCOTLAND.

EXAMINATION OF NURSES.

On November 18th and subsequent days the Local Government Board for Scotland held an examination for the certification of trained sick nurses and of trained fever nurses. The examination was held at Glasgow, Edinburgh, Dundee and Aberdeen. The examiners were Dr. Templeman, Medical Officer of Health, Dundee; Dr. Mackintosh, Western Infirmary, Glasgow; Dr. Brownlie, Ruchill Hospital, Glasgow; and Dr. Johnston, Eastern District Hospital, Glasgow, who were assisted in the practical part of the examination by Miss Thomas, Matron of the City Hospital, Edinburgh, and by Miss Merchant, Matron of the Eastern District Hospital, Glasgow.

The subjects of examination were Elementary Anatomy and Physiology; Hygiene and Dietetics; Medical and Surgical Nursing; Midwifery (for Poor Law and General trained nurses); and Infectious Diseases (for Fever trained nurses only). In all, 165 candidates presented themselves for examination. Of these, 85 were examined in Anatomy and Physiology; 51 in Hygiene and Dietetics; 54 in Medical and Surgical Nursing (for Poor Law and General trained

nurses); 19 in Medical and Surgical Nursing (for Fever trained Nurses); 28 in Midwifery, and 21 in Infectious Diseases.
