## THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE FOR THE STATE REGISTRATION OF TRAINED NURSES.

The Central Committee for the State Registration of Trained Nurses is composed of five delegates from each of the eight affiliated societies of medical practitioners and trained nurses, of which Lord Ampthill, G.C.I.E., G.C.S.I. is chairman.

This Committee has agreed upon the Nurses' Registration Bill, which Mr. R. C. Munro-Ferguson, M.P., has brought into the House of Commons for several years, but which has not yet had time granted for a second reading.
