THE CARE OF LYING-IN WOMEN.

The Minister for Internal Affairs in France has, says the correspondent of the *Lancet* in Paris, in view of the disquieting infant mortality, requested the Académie de Médecine to draw up instructions and distribute them among those lying-in women entitled to the maternity benefit, to which reference was made four weeks ago. The drawing up of these instructions, which must be couched in clear and easily understood language, and must include all those points persistent neglect of which will forfeit the benefit, was committed to Professor Pinard, who has now presented them to the Academy. They prescribe careful medical supervision of the woman from the eighth month. The benefit will be granted only on a medical certificate mentioning the expected date of labour. After the confinement it is ordered that the mother must keep her bed for ten days, suckle her child, abstain from alcoholic drinks and fatiguing household labour, and particularly from the use of the sewing machine. She must daily give the necessary attention to the child's entire body, particularly the eyes; she must not lay it on its back, but alternately on one side or the other; the breast must be given every two hours; and the medical man must be summoned on the appearance of the least trouble. Persistent disregard of these instructions in spite of the advice of the medical man must be reported to the mayor, who will stop the benefit.
