preparation and administration of enemas—soap, turpentine, and starch—hot air and vapour baths and hot and cold packs.

SECOND YEAR.

Fifteen lectures on Anatomy, Physiology and Bacteriology are given by an Assistant Physician, an Assistant Surgeon, and a Casualty Assistant Physician, or a Surgical Casualty Officer.

Four lectures on Obstetric and Gynæcological Nursing by the Assistant Obstetric Officer; the Aural Surgeon and Laryngologist lectures on the Nursing of Ear and Throat Cases, and the Resident Surgical Officer on the Nursing of Eye Cases.

THIRD YEAR.

Very comprehensive lectures on medical nursing are given by an Assistant Physician, and on Surgical Nursing by an Assistant Surgeon.

Tutorial Classes are also taken by the Home Sister after each lecture of the third year course, to supervise the notes taken by the nurses, and to see that the lectures have been properly understood.

SCHOOL OF MASSAGE.

The hospital has also a School of Massage, Swedish Remedial Exercises, and Electrical Treatment under a qualified and certificated teacher, the fee for tuition being £21 for a term of six months. Pupils are expected to enter for the examinations of the Incorporated Society of Trained Masseuses, and to bear the expense of their own examination. Ionic Medication, if taught, requires a further month, for which a fee of £3 10s. is charged; and Swedish Remedial Exercises, other than those used daily in conjunction with massage, require an additional six months' course after the massage certificate has been obtained.

A few resident pupils can be received, the fees for trained nurses for board, lodging, and the usual amount of washing, being £13 for the term of 26 weeks. Daily pupils may dine at the nurses' table on payment of £5 per term of six months.

It will thus be seen that the advantages offered by the hospital are many, and pupils who receive their training there are to be congratulated.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS.

The arrangements for the Meeting of the International Council of Nurses, and Nursing Congress and Exhibition, to be held at San Francisco in June, 1915, are in a wonderfully forward state on the other side of the Atlantic. As this Journal is the organ of the International Council in the United Kingdom, all official news will be found from time to time in its columns. Nurses should make a point of acquainting themselves with the progress of their work in all parts of the world. The British Journal of Nursing tries to keep them well informed in this particular.
