The National Union of Trained Nurses are showing model of Train and of Hospital Tents, V.A.D. and Territorial Plan, Models of Rashes, Models of Fæces, Room before and after the advent of the District Nurse, Historic Dolls, Model Baby and Model Clothes for Baby, and Posters.

Lord Mayor Treloar's Cripples' Hospital, Alton, will have on view Stand and Splint for treatment of Spinal Caries, Celluloid Splint, and Spinal Jacket, and Linen marked by machinery.
