

GIFTS FOR THE FUND.

Lady Barclay has received a third big case from Mrs. Keith Peter, St. Lucia, W. Indies, containing 5 big feather pillows and 9 smaller, 2 dozen pillow cases, 12 towels, 18 dusters, and 9 dozen bags. From Miss Scott, of Bowden, who has already sent many things, amongst others 32 dozen handkerchiefs, 4 large pillows with four clips for each, a packet of beautiful large towels, 18 from Nurse Randall, of Bath. Some of these articles have gone to France, but all the gifts, amongst them nearly 50 feather pillows, will be distributed at an early date. Mrs. Holgate has asked for 18 pillows for the ward in which she worked at Neufchateau, where those in use were stuffed with hay, and they are to be sent. The hospital at Neufchateau has recently received supplies from Madame de la Panouse, Croix Rouge Française, London, and from other friends; but typhoid patients well deserve to rest their weary heads on a comfy pillow—and many of the wards have already been supplied with these luxuries.

The cold weather is now upon us and we shall receive with much gratitude knitted socks, mufflers, waistcoats, dressing gowns, and flannel shirts for distribution in the hospitals in which Sisters of the F.F.N.C. are working.
