### CARE OF THE WOUNDED.

Mufflers are urgently needed at the Front, and should be sent either to the Voluntary Organisations' depots throughout the country; to the D.G.V.O.'s depot at 45, Horseferry Road, London, S.W., or to Mr. J. Lenoyre. Each muffler should measure 58 in. by 10 in. and be made on two No. 7 needles, taking 10 oz. of fairly thick drab or khaki wool.

On the occasion of the visit of the Duke of Connaught to the Union Jack Club, Waterloo Road, last Saturday afternoon, Mr. Heath Harrison, the High Sheriff of Hampshire, presented the Duke with a cheque for £44,000, making (together with his previous anonymous donation) a total of £50,000 to the extension fund of the club. Cleanliness, warmth and comfort to hand for our sailors and soldiers in these well-equipped clubs prevents untold suffering.
