fund will take account of the assistance provided by the State in deciding how their funds may be best applied.

By the courtesy of the editor of the Scots Pictorial we are able to publish a picture of Staff-Nurse Agnes Murdoch Climie, who was recently killed by bombing in a general hospital in France. Miss Climie, who was trained at the Royal Infirmary, Glasgow, was a member of the Territorial Force Nursing Service, and was on the staff of the 4th Scottish General Hospital, Stobhill, from

the beginning of the war till last spring. Though not on duty during the raid, she went to her ward, and when killed was singing to a patient who was nervous. She was "mentioned" for valuable services in March last.

Since the outbreak of war, the Personnel Sub-Committee(Trained Nurse Department) of the Edinburgh and East of ScotlandBranch,British Red Cross Society, 80A, Princes Street, Edinburgh, həs made over 300 appointments of Matrons and Nurses to positions in hospital, both at home and abroad.
