Miss Irvine Robertson has resigned the position of matron of the Anglo-Russian Hospital at Petrograd, and the lady, who has been appointed to succeed her, will leave this week for Russia with several Sisters.

The Units of American Nurses have had a very cordial recept on in France, we shall await reports of their helpful and interesting work by and by. Many of their colleagues in the States are very eager to come over and give a helping hand, and we learn that the Army Nurse Corps will form a very important contingent, attached to the regulars of the United States Army when on active service in France. For a year past the care of the sick and wounded has been well considered and organised.

A Sister writes: "I feel I must thank you for all that you are doing for us in connection with the Registration Bill. A great many of us who are out of Britain at present, and are unable to take an active part in the movement, may appear to be apathetic, but that is not the case. We realise fully that a great deal of hard work is being done for us and we really appreciate it."

Our point is, that whilst these trained nurses are devoting their entire energies to the care of sick and wounded abroad and at home, their professional organisation should not have been meddled with by a body of Nursing School nominees. The truth is that what is being done has not been done with the consent of the nursing profession at large.
