the operation of tracheotomy.

5. Describe the signs and symptoms to be observed in a case of measles during the first six

days of the disease. What is the length of the incubation period?

6. Describe the arrangements you would make in a room in a private house with a view to nursing a case of infectious disease.

#### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL, 1917-1918.

In presenting the Ninth Annual Report, your Council has not the same progress to report as in former years. The number of nurses added to the Register, after passing the Association's examination, remains about the same, but the support and active co-operation of Medical and Matron members is very much diminished, their energies being absorbed by the war. Notwithstanding, your Council is maintaining the purposes for which the Association was formed.

1. Applications for membership and registration during the past year bring the total number of members and nurses holding the Fever Nurses' Association Certificate up to 2,380.

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
